

CHECK –IN: Day campers register on Monday at the front office from 7:30-8:30 A.M. Campers are signed in daily in the cafeteria. All medication is to be turned in during check-in.

CHECK-OUT: Campers are signed out from 5-5:30 P.M. with the Cabin Counselor. **THINGS TO BRING**—Please label all items!

- 1. tennis shoes and comfortable clothing for activities; a jacket or sweater/ sweatshirt for cool weather
- 2. a pool bag with these items: one-piece swimsuit, towel, flip flops, sunscreen, hair brush, a change of underwear

THINGS NOT TO BRING: electronic devices (for example: cell phone, iPad, tablet, etc). Leave all valuable things at home. The camp is not responsibleble for damaged, lost, or stolen items.

TRANSPORTATION: Campers are asked to carpool with other families. Parents park in the front parking lot and walk their child to the cafeteria.

TALENT SHOW: To be in the Friday Talent Show, parents must sign campers up by Tuesday. On Friday, for an extra fee, day campers may stay to eat dinner. Families are invited for the Talent Show from 7:30 - 9 P.M.

MEALS: Breakfast is served at 8 A.M. and lunch at noon. Snacks are sold at canteen time in the afternoon.

MONEY & CANTEEN CARDS: Campers are not allowed to keep money or food in the Cabin. Canteen cards are available for \$10 each.

<u>CABIN WEEKLY MASS:</u> On a designated day, each cabin is in charge of Mass. Campers should come dressed nicely for this day. Parents/families are welcome to attend Mass.

CAMP PICTURE: Camp group pictures are sold for \$5 for an 8x10 print. Please send your child with their Camp T-shirt/sweatshirt on Tuesday which is picture day.

CAMP AWARDS ON FRIDAY: Every Friday, camp awards and prizes are given to the campers at 5 PM. Day campers are invited to stay until 5:30 on Fridays.

EXTRA ACTIVITIES: Campers are welcome to join in any evening activity on an understanding with the camp directress. An extra fee will be assessed accordingly.



Resident Camp Information

CHECK-IN Campers arrive Sunday between 1-4 P.M. at the front office. ALL medications must be labeled and left at the front desk. Parents are welcome to visit the campus.

CHECK-OUT Campers may be checked out on Friday evening after the Talent Show or Saturday morning before 11:00 A.M.

TRANSPORTATION

Private cars: Parents are responsible for transportation.

Airline Arrivals: Arrive SUNDAY between 11 A.M.—2:00 PM at the San Jose Airport. Airport pickup fee is \$60 per immediate family.

Airline Departures: Flights need to be scheduled between 10 AM-12 Noon on SATURDAY.

VISITING HOURS

Families may visit on Sunday between 10 AM-3PM. Parents need to notify the Camp Directress if they plan to take the camper off the premises and must sign the campers in and out. Campers may not leave the premises without written permis- sion of the parent or guardian.

LAUNDRY

For resident campers who are staying for more than two weeks consecutively, an additional fee is charged for laundry service.

MEDICATION All medicines must be turned in upon arrival to the front office and will be administered by the Camp Directress or her designated representative.

MONEY & CANTEEN CARDS

Campers are not allowed to keep money or documents with them. These must be checked in at the front office upon arrival. A canteen card with \$10 value can be purchased at the time of check in. The canteen is open every afternoon for snacks, drinks, stamps, postcards, ice cream, etc. For health purposes, campers may not bring, receive by mail, or keep extra food. No food is allowed in the cabins.

COMMUNICATION

Phone Calls: Campers who stay more than one week may use their cell phones to call home on Sunday afternoons. If you need to contact your child, please call the Camp Directress who will locate your daughter.

Email: Emails may be sent tocampauxiliumcalifornia@gmail.com with your child's name in the subject line. Emails will be given out daily. Campers do not have access to re-spond via-email but may use regular mail.

Mail: Campers enjoy receiving mail and would benefit by coming pre- pared with stamps and stationery.

CHECK LIST OF THINGS TO BRING Please label all items!

Bedding: sleeping bag, pillow & case, shower towel, pajamas

The camp does not provide towels or bedding.

<u>Swim wear:</u> one-piece swimsuit only (no low or high cut suits), pool bag, towel, sunscreen and swim cap based on level color (red-beginner; white intermediate; blue-proficient). Caps may be purchased at time of check-in.

Clothing: appropriate, modest, & comfortable

- between 7-9 changes of clothes;
- · shirts/dresses: no spaghetti straps, no low cuts;
- pants/shorts: no low riders, no short shorts;
- · dress outfit: a nice dress or skirt for Mass
- jackets/sweaters/sweatshirts: at least one of each

<u>Footwear:</u> tennis shoes, dress shoes/sandals, flip flops, shower shoes

<u>Toiletries:</u> laundry bag, shampoo, body wash/soap, personal products, sun block, lotion, tooth paste, and soap.

NOTE: Please do not bring any electronic device such as cell phone, IPad, tablet, game systems, etc. Leave jewelry and expensive items at home. The camp is not responsible for any items lost, stolen, or damaged. The camp provides some reading material. Appropriate books are allowed.
