


For a simple Lenten reflection, instead of an article, I thought sharing a diagram about

The Law of ANABOLISM


The phase of metabolism in which simple substances are synthesized into the complex materials of living tissue.

The True Presence of Jesus



My name is Hayden, and I'm from Colorado. In our religion class with Sr. Quynh, we were asked to write an essay on the true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist using evidence from the Old and New Testaments and the Eucharistic Miracles. The following is a brief version of my essay.

In the Genesis Creation story, God spoke and what He spoke came to be. He created the entire universe and everything in it by telling it to exist. This goes to show that the Word of God has power over everything.

In the Gospel of John, it is said, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14). This quote shows that Jesus is the Word of God and therefore has power over all creation. The miracles in the gospels give us evidence of the power of Jesus' word. One example is from Mark 4:35-41. Jesus was on a boat with His apostles when a storm came. Jesus woke up and said, "Peace! Be still," and the storm calmed.

The greatest miracle of all was at the Last Supper, where Jesus said, "This is my Body" and "This is my Blood." If everything else Jesus has said has come to be, then why should this be any different? If Jesus himself told us that, "This is my Body and Blood," it must be true because Jesus does not lie. If Jesus lied, then our entire faith would be false. St. Cyril of Jerusalem stated, "Since Christ Himself has said, 'This is My Body,' who shall dare to doubt that it is His Body?"

Why does Jesus want us to eat His Flesh and drink His Blood? It's because He wants us to "have eternal life" with Him (John 6:54). The Eucharist therefore, is our "true food and drink" to remain in Him and He in us (John 6:56). The presence of God and His salvation are demonstrated in the Eucharist and Eucharistic miracles. Blessed Carlo Acutis created a website to show us all of the miracles sent by God regarding the Eucharist.

With all of this information in mind, I now understand and believe that Jesus is truly present - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity - in the Eucharist. His promise to "stay with us until the end of time" is true (Matthew 28:20).

A few weeks later, the family returned to the Provincial House. They had done testing and discovered that their son was cancer-free! They gave praise to God for His divine healing and celebrated His love and mercy.

The Sisters were invited to surprise Jose and his family when they later returned to San Antonio. He would be ringing the infamous bell to celebrate being cancer-free. What a wonderful miracle and reminder that when we break bread with others, we share Jesus.
